Year 13 & Year 12 Results Day 13th August 2020

Dear Parents and Carers,

We are pleased to announce that we are able to invite all students into school to collect their exam results in person on Thursday 13th August. We feel, this year, it is more important than ever to be able to congratulate students on their achievements; console those who haven't achieved the results they were hoping for, and to offer our students care, guidance and support on their next steps, if needed. The event will be subject to any changes in Government advice released over the next few weeks and we will communicate changes via our social media platforms, the website and via ParentMail.

This year, we are using our PRE booking system to allow students to book a single time slot to come in and collect their results. We have chosen this process, rather than allocating students a time slot in alphabetical order, to enable friends to arrive at similar times and share their results with each other. For Year 13 this will be between 8am and 11am, and for Year 12 this will be between 1pm and 3pm, The link to the booking systems is here at <https://samwhit.schoolcloud.co.uk/>. Please do not contact by telephone as the office is not staffed continuously throughout the holidays. The booking system will open on Friday 17th July at 12.00pm and close at 12pm on Wednesday 12th August.

Once you have selected a time slot, this is the **only** time that your child will be allowed on site to collect their results and we cannot accommodate requests outside of the advertised hours. To ensure we are minimising the number of people on site and adhering to social distancing guidance, each student can be accompanied by **one** other member of their household.

If the student is unable to collect their results on the day, they can either nominate another person to collect these on their behalf or request them to be sent through the post. If you chose to have results collected by another person, you will need to complete the google form - the link of which has been sent to your child's school email account. Requests will **only** be accepted from school email accounts. If you prefer to receive results through the post, then you will need to send us a stamped addressed envelope with your name and candidate number written clearly on the front. You can send this in via the post, or you can drop it into school reception and post into the post box provided.

Upon arrival at the reception gate, all visitors will be asked to sanitise their hands before proceeding to the Sport Hall to collect their results. Should a student wish to receive further advice and guidance from the 6th Form, our careers department or pastoral members of staff, they will be asked to make their way to the Activities Hall and Street. All routes will be clearly signposted and staff will be on hand to direct students accordingly.

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We would ask that all visitors follow the latest advice from the DfE which states:

Schools, FE colleges and other skills providers planning to open their doors to pupils and students on results day should continue to follow the hierarchy of controls they have used over the summer term, and that summer holiday providers are following during August.

In particular this means:

- ensuring that those who have coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms, or who have someone in their household who does, do not attend school and/or college or other provider
- cleaning hands more often than usual
- ensuring good respiratory hygiene by promoting the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach
- minimising contact and mixing as far as possible, by keeping pupils and students in small consistent groups. Schools, FE colleges and other providers should aim to practise social distancing in line with current government guidance on social distancing.

Students, pupils and parents should follow Coronavirus (COVID-19): safer travel guidance for passengers when planning their travel to school, and be encouraged to walk or cycle where possible.

Centre Assessed Grades (CAGs)

These are the grades that we, as a Centre agreed and submitted to the exam boards following an internal quality assurance process and are not the sole responsibility of any individual teacher. These are confidential and all staff have been instructed not to disclose or discuss these grades with either students, parents or carers.

After submission to the exam boards, the centre assessed grades were then subjected to a standardisation model developed by Ofqual and the awarding organisations. This is a statistical process and therefore, the grades achieved may not reflect the grades submitted by us (The Centre). The standardisation process ensures grades awarded this year are consistent with those awarded to historical cohorts. It takes into account both school prior attainment and national prior attainment figures in all of the subjects. This [infographic](#) from Ofqual explains the awarding process, and this [link](#) provides more detailed guidance for students, parents and carers, which Ofqual plan to supplement over the coming weeks. Please remember that the process adopted by our Academy was the fairest possible approach available under extreme circumstances. It is a rigorous process which means that grades awarded this year are as valid as in any other year.

A student's Centre Assessed Grades will be available on results day, upon request, for those who may need this evidence to progress onto the next stage.

Appeals and Complaints

Dissatisfaction with the grades issued by exam boards does not constitute grounds for appeal, unless there is evidence that there has been a technical error by the Centre or the Board. Every Centre will receive instructions from the exam boards including a form for appeals if they believe there has been an error, either on their own part or that of the board. Candidates can complain to the Centre about the process, for example if they believe they have suffered from discrimination or bias. There will, as we now know, be an opportunity for students who are unhappy with their grades to sit exams in the Autumn Term.

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Autumn Series of exams

If a student is unhappy with the grades issued by the exam boards then the Government has announced that all A level qualifications will be available to be taken in the Autumn Series of exams. This is currently timetabled for October 2020. Current guidance states that the grades will be based solely upon exam performance and will mainly not include any contribution from coursework marks or NEA. Further guidance and information is available [here](#). Students will not be discriminated against if they achieve a lower grade in the Autumn Series compared to their Final Calculated Grade, as the highest grade will count. There will be no cost to the student associated with taking these exams in the Autumn series.

There will be a form listing all the qualifications available in the Autumn series in your results envelope should you wish to sit an examination in the Autumn. Please complete this indicating which subject you want to be entered for and return to the Exams office by 3pm on **Thursday 3rd September**.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your patience and understanding. The Academy looks forward to seeing many of you on Thursday 13th August. We wish you every success in your chosen pathways. Have a restful summer break and best wishes for your future.
