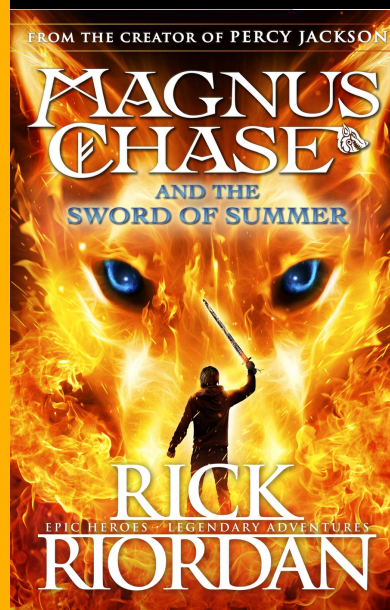
At Samuel Whitbread Academy, we prioritise reading to ensure every student can read confidently for pleasure and progress.

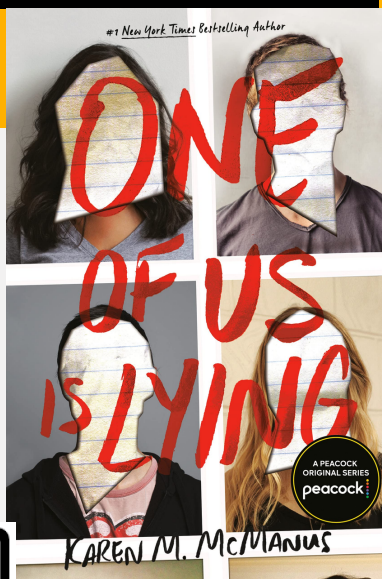
