ACHIEVEMENT AND STANDARDS

Academic Success

The results this year at GCSE were the highest ever achieved by students at Samuel Whitbread. An impressive 74% of students gained a 9-4 and 48% of students gained a 9-5 in both English and maths, making us one of the highest performing schools in the Local Authority. Students performed well across the board with 77% of all grades at 4 or above and 45 students achieving two or more grade 9s. In maths, a record breaking 82% of students achieved a 9-4 and 57% achieved 9-5, and in English, 81% achieved a 9-4 and 64% achieved a 9-5.

In the Sixth Form, 96% of students went off to their first choice university, with 74% of all grades at A*-C or equivalent. As well as three students studying medicine, one of which will be studying at Cambridge, we also have one student reading veterinary studies and the Head Boy is off to read Geography at Oxford. Several students left us to start level 3 apprenticeships at companies such as Santander and three boys from the rugby programme secured professional contracts this year.

Promoting Achievement

We have high expectations of all our students and we believe every child has talents that can be nurtured with the right support and encouragement. The size and success of Samuel Whitbread means that we can continue to offer a balanced and modern curriculum which is second to none. We also have an incredible array of educational visits and guest speakers to help enhance the learning experience.

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FACILITIES AND RESOURCES

The buildings and facilities at Samuel Whitbread are outstanding. They provide our students and staff with a fantastic environment in which to learn and work. In addition to well-appointed classrooms, we have a number of specialist facilities designed for 'A' Level standard work - that are also used by younger age groups. We have a spacious and well stocked library which is open to everyone, as well as several independent study rooms for our Sixth Form students.

For engineering and design technology we have a number of workshops with specialist equipment such as laser cutters and 3D printers. We have 14 science laboratories which are supported by a well-stocked science prep room and a dedicated team of technicians.

Art and textiles students benefit from a suite of rooms with a range of equipment including Apple computers for design and two kilns for pottery and ceramic work. Our drama and dance students use the theatre and four studios, with sprung floors, lighting, mirrors and sound equipment. Students studying music or film have access to a recording studio and use digital recording kit with high powered editing equipment and the latest industry standard software.



We have three fully equipped indoor performance spaces including a theatre, hall and activities studio. Physical Education and sport have many hard areas, large sports hall (with its own viewing gallery), extensive grounds and pitches that are second to none as well as a brand new gym!

We have ten specialist computer suites and a number of other IT facilities for students to use. We also encourage students to use their own devices and we recently upgraded the wireless broadband to accommodate a much broader bandwidth.

Key Stage 3 & 4

When commencing their studies at Samuel Whitbread Academy students have a broad and balanced curriculum offer from the start, and one which is carefully blended to ensure academic progress and enable opportunities to experience the option subjects that will be available to students from Year 10 onwards.

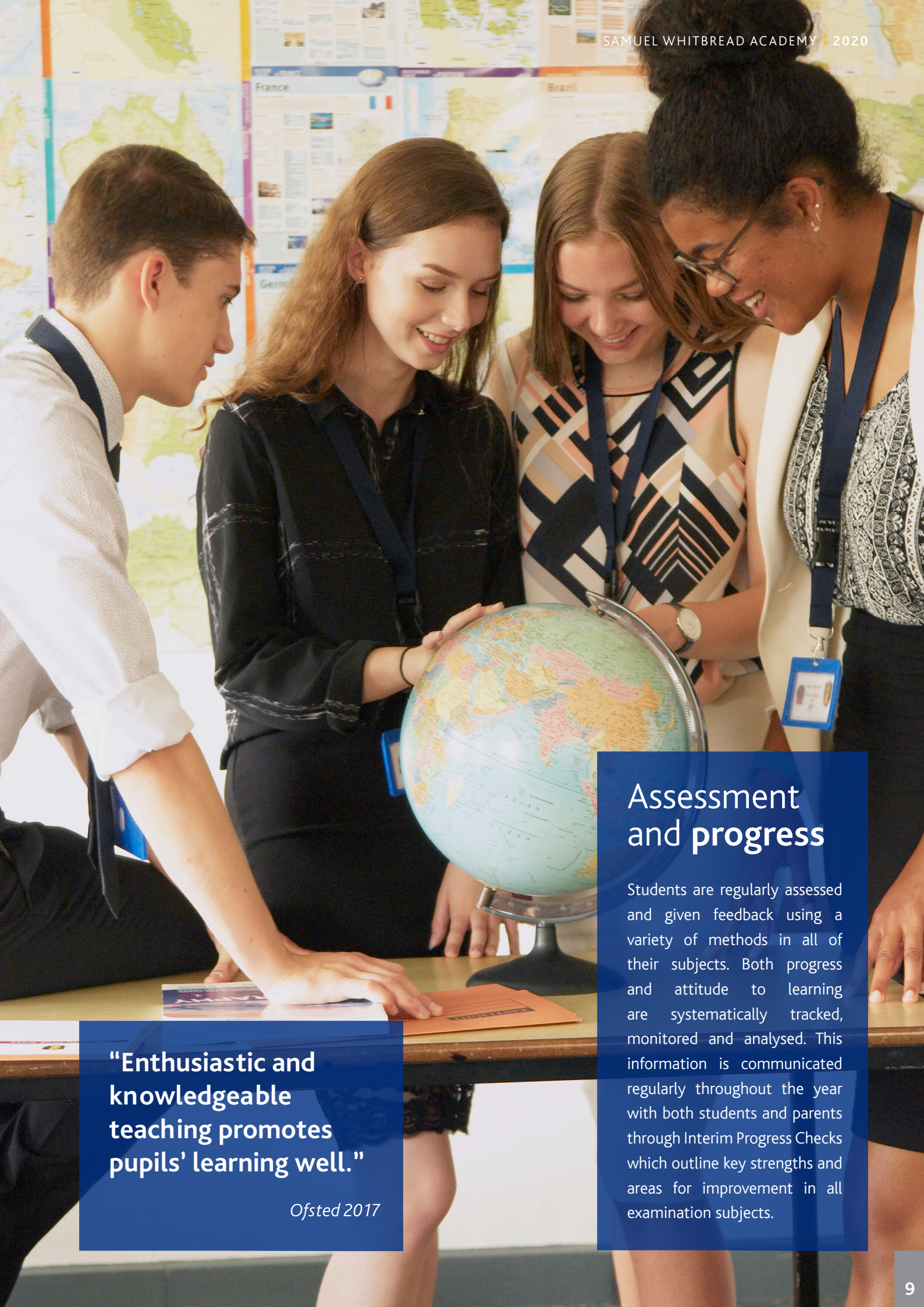
Our Key Stage 4 curriculum is second to none and has been designed to strike a balance between making sure students study a wide range of subjects and allowing them to develop their own interests. We have taken great care to ensure the offer at Key Stage 4 reflects the rapidly changing national picture, where GCSEs are undergoing fundamental reform. It also ensures that the academy is complying with the current government proposals, which are continuing to move towards an English Baccalaureate.

Post 16

The size of the Sixth Form at Samuel Whitbread means our curriculum offer at Post 16 is second to none. We offer 37 courses in the Sixth Form. Following the recent government reforms to A Levels, we recommend that students study three courses (with the exception of some of the most able students and students taking Further Maths who often take four). Alongside these courses, we offer a range of extra-curricular courses including the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) which is highly regarded by Universities.

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Assessment and progress

Students are regularly assessed and given feedback using a variety of methods in all of their subjects. Both progress and attitude to learning are systematically tracked, monitored and analysed. This information is communicated regularly throughout the year with both students and parents through Interim Progress Checks which outline key strengths and areas for improvement in all examination subjects.



SPORT AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION

At Samuel Whitbread we have two key principles that guide our sports and physical education. Firstly, we want everybody to take part in the extensive range of sports and activities that we have available, so they find a sport or type of exercise that they enjoy and continue outside of school.

Secondly, we thrive on competition, or to put it another way, we like to WIN! If your child loves sport and wants to excel, then this is the school for you. We expect our sporting teams to train hard and to win. We are the most decorated sporting school in Bedfordshire, holding more district, county, regional and national titles than any other school in the county.

Our girls football shows immense talent with the U14s and U15s becoming both District and County Champions last year, and our less recognised but growing sports of futsal and handball have seen us progress to regional finals.

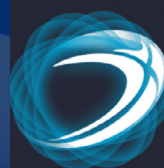

CLUBS AND ACTIVITIES

THE HOUSE SYSTEM

We have five houses, each named after a prominent local personality or family who have contributed to our community. The houses are led by a member of staff and our sixth formers who are house captains, prefects, sports and charities captains. The houses have a busy programme of competitions, house council meetings and charity events and every year each house selects a particular charity to support. Throughout the year, the members of each house work together across all years to form a caring and united community, culminating in the House Olympics!



CHARITY WORK

We believe it is important that students raise funds and support people in our own country and around the world who have lives less fortunate than ours. Students can take part in the National Citizenship Service Awards and use their contribution to their houses as part of this. As a school we support national and local charities, as well as the Jambo School in Kenya and Tafo in Ghana, for whom we raise money to develop their facilities and buy much needed equipment.

PERSONALISED LEARNING

Our teaching and learning strategy is centred on the idea that every pupil is embarking upon their own personal learning journey at Samuel Whitbread. Individual academic targets, based upon prior data, are regularly reviewed by academic and pastoral staff to ensure that our pupils and their parents always know where they are on that journey and what they need to do to reach their destination and full potential.

Our well qualified subject specialists work hard to create a learning environment which inspires and stimulates students' interests, as well as giving personalised support and guidance to help all students reach aspirational targets.

Termly targets for progress in the core subjects, plus pupil/teacher reviews and evaluations at the end of every term, ensure that students have the opportunity to maximise their potential and achieve and excel. These individual targets and analysis of assessments help inform our teachers' planning so they best adapt their teaching to meet the learning needs of all the pupils in their care.

Homework is uploaded onto the site 'Show My Homework' so students (and their parents!) can see what homework has been set and when it is due 24/7.



CARE, GUIDANCE AND SUPPORT

We are very proud of the pastoral system at Samuel Whitbread. During the transition from middle school all pupils are placed into tutor groups and assigned a form tutor. This is a key role within the pastoral system and students remain with their tutor from Year 9 to 11. They have daily contact with their tutor group, where they discuss important issues such as internet safety, healthy eating and British values - as part of the PSHE curriculum.

The tutors are supported by their Head of Year and a dedicated Pastoral Support Officer (PSO), who work closely with the Senior Leadership Team and the Heads of Department to carefully monitor student behaviour and academic progress. They also liaise between school, home and Central Bedfordshire's support services where necessary.

We have a strong and well developed Learning Support Department that supports students with Special Educational Needs. The dedicated team work with staff and students in classrooms to help them achieve their very best, as well as providing a package of support outside of the classroom to meet the needs of each student. The vast majority of students enjoy life at school and get on well with each other. On the few occasions when students do misbehave our Assertive Discipline System deals with this effectively and efficiently.

PARTNERSHIPS

We greatly value our partnership work in the community. We share many of our support services with the other schools in the trust and jointly develop our teaching and pastoral systems. We also work closely with all of the other schools in our catchment area to ensure that transition across our pyramid is as smooth as possible.

One of the ways that we develop our teaching is through the Schools University Partnership in Educational Research (SUPER) at Cambridge University. Through this network we exchange ideas and learn from other schools across the country as well as teachers from Kazakhstan, Sweden, Holland and the USA.

Our partnerships in engineering are excellent. Local and national companies provide opportunities for our students to experience work in an industrial setting and experts from these companies come into the academy to provide advice and materials. Our very successful Formula 24 teams started with the support of our engineering partners.

The Arts too have a number of partners who support and work with us to give our students the very best opportunities available. As a result we are regularly invited to play at both local and national events including receiving an invitation to play for Prince Philip at the Chartered College of Teaching.

We are not satisfied with being the best school in the county for sport and as a result we have developed partnerships with a wide range of outstanding organisations. In rugby, for example, our partnership with Northampton Saints School of Rugby Excellence attracts players from all over the county to receive coaching at the highest level and be part of the Saints development squads.



This year we have teamed up with Saracens Mavericks in an exciting new venture to provide outstanding opportunities for our netballers lead by our Director of Netball and High Performance Netball Coach.

Following many years of football success, we are also excited to launch the Whitbread Football Academy to be lead by our new Director of Football.
