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WHY SWA SIXTH FORM?

Last year our students gained excellent KS5 results with 83% of entries gaining A* - C grades (or equivalent) and 30% of entries gaining A* - A grades (or equivalent). This success has allowed students to progress either onto their chosen university or into a career pursuing professional qualifications. This year 98% of the Year 13s who applied went to one of their top choice universities. Other students went onto some amazing apprenticeships, further education and degree programmes.

We have a wide range of academic and vocational courses to suit students' individual learning needs and a comprehensive range of enrichment and extra curricular activities (Please see enrichment booklet on the website). We encourage our students to get involved and play a productive role in our community.

STUDENT VOICE

In the Sixth Form there is a range of opportunities for students to become involved in academy life and the wider community, which we call 'Student Voice'. Students are encouraged to take responsibility for improving the learning environment and 'Student Voice' is an excellent platform for this type of activity. Leadership roles include; Students as Researchers, Students as Interviewers, Student Leadership Group, House Captains, Senior Student Prefects, Head Boy and Head Girl team.

A LEVEL

Advanced Level qualification consists of modules studied over two years. At the end of Year 13 the reformed A Level courses are examined.

A levels are awarded pass grades A* to E.

BTEC & APPLIED GENERAL AND ALTERNATIVE ACADEMIC QUALIFICATIONS (AAQs)

Are work-related qualifications equivalent to A levels, and are also studied over 2 years. We offer the following qualifications that are awarded Pass, Merit and Distinction grades.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- To study all A Level courses a minimum of five grade 5's need to be achieved at GCSE.
- To study all BTEC and/or applied level 3 courses a minimum of six grade 4's need to be achieved at GCSE

LEVEL 3 COURSES

Please see specific minimum entry requirements and APS for further guidance. These are on pages 8, 9 and 10.

Please Note Any students who have not achieved their Maths and/or English Language GCSE at grade 4 will be expected to resit these in the Sixth Form until a grade 4 is achieved. Without GCSE English and maths at grade 4 it will restrict access to a lot of courses or further higher education opportunities after Sixth Form. A student cannot join Sixth Form if they don't have at least a grade 4 in Maths or English.

ENRICHMENT STUDIES

All students are expected to take an additional course to enrich their Sixth Form experience. For September we plan to offer the following timetabled enrichments: Extended Project Qualification, L3 Core Maths, the Northampton Saints Rugby Development Programme, the Samuel Whitbread Football academy and the Saracens Mavericks Netball Academy.

Enrichment opportunities that cannot be timetabled but which we encourage our students to do, can be found in the Sixth Form enrichment handbook in the enrichment section of the Sixth Form webpage.

Please note that these opportunities may be subject to change.
