



Paper 3: Synoptic Geography	20% of total grade. Range of issues from the entire course.		
NEA: Independent Investigation	20% of total grade. Your chosen investigation explored.		



Minimum Entry Requirements

- Average Points Score required: 5.1
- Grade 5 in GCSE Geography
- Grade 5 in GCSE English Language OR Literature
- **Grade 5** in GCSE Mathematics (*discussion* with department if Grade 4 is achieved).

A Level Geography contains mathematical and statistical skills and tasks, as well as extended writing featuring in every part of the course.

The GCSE grades are therefore vital to ensure you can succeed and have the skills you need to access A Level Geography.

<u>Fieldwork</u>



This is a compulsory requirement by Edexcel to complete a minimum of 4 days of fieldwork over the 2 years of the course.

Compulsory Fieldwork:

- Leeson House Fieldwork Centre, Dorset.
 - February 2023: £350-450.
 - Collection of all NEA data for your investigation.




You will need the following at the start of the course to see you through the two years!
