Watch the TV Series <u>High Score</u> - Available via Netflix A documentary series charting the history of popular videogames.

The Story of Film

Watch **The Story of Film: An Odyssey -** the Mark Cousins series is available on DVD/Blu Ray The Story of Film: An Odyssey is a 2011 British documentary film about the history of film. Research Tasks

History of Video Games

Research into the history of videogames - create a visual display on either Photoshop or Canva for each generation - including key games, hardware, characters and industry figures.

Journal Articles

You can search for names, and it will come up with a wide variety for each theorist.

History of Radio

Attend a Guardian Event - many are still online, but there will be more in-person events in future. Look out for some that relate to investigative journalism of the company.

Creative Tasks

Opening Scene Create an opening scene for a film/TV episode screenplay using <u>CelTx</u>. Use advice on screenwriting widely available online.

Breaking down a scene

Create an audio-visual essay, breaking down a key scene from your favourite film or TV show into the four key micro elements of AV media (MES/Sound/Editing/Cinematography). Use Adobe Premiere or Da Vinci Resiolve to make your project. Useful link
