Sixth Form Anti-Social Behaviour and Respect Contract

As a result of ongoing anti-social behaviour and/or lack of respect, or your involvement/presence in an antisocial behaviour incident and/or lack of respect incident, you are being placed on this personalised contract to ensure you have clear sanctions moving forward if this continues – the aim is for you to avoid entry onto the main school behaviour system at the point of agreeing to this contract – a chance for you to change your behaviours. Please read these sanction stages carefully to ensure you understand that from the date on which you sign this, you will be taken through the below stages if this behaviour or presence around unacceptable behaviour, continues. As Sixth Form students you signed an agreement when you joined and this contract also reminds you of the attitude and behaviour aspects you agreed to when joining the Sixth Form. Please see the reverse of this document for that agreement.

Recommendation moving forward: If you are part of a group where other students are undertaking inappropriate behaviours, you should do the following to ensure you are not guilty by association:

- 1) Leave the room or area so you are not associated or part of the behaviour
- 2) Ideally report to a member of staff to ensure action can be taken straight away with those students responsible for any inappropriate behaviour.

Personalised sanction stages (these change depending on the student and/or group of students) if any further antisocial behaviour or lack of respect is reported involving you or a group you are in at a specific time on school site:

<u>Stage 1 – Privileges taken away and a parental meeting with the Head of Year and Sports Academy Leader (B2 equivalent)</u>

<u>Stage 2 – Restrictions placed upon timetable e.g removal from some non-qualification enrichment hours –</u> <u>different methods can be used here but this will ensure students can still access lessons where they have</u> <u>qualification hours (B3 equivalent). This will involve a further parental meeting with the Head of Year</u>

<u>Stage 3 – Further restrictions placed upon timetable e.g removal from all non-qualification enrichment hours –</u> <u>this will ensure students can still access lessons where they have qualification hours and could include additional</u> <u>timetabled lessons and allocation of free/study/prep periods. (B4 equivalent). This will involved an escalated</u> <u>parental meeting with the Associate Principal – Head of Sixth Form.</u>

ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

By joining Samuel Whitbread's Sixth Form you have agreed to...

- Attend all lessons, every day of the academic year with the obvious exception of genuine illness and personal circumstances such as bereavement.
- You must swipe in and out with ID cards at the side gates.
- Provide parental written support for all absences in advance, when known, or on the first day back in school. Any
 sickness has to be reported on the first day and any subsequent days via telephone, or email to the Pastoral
 and Academic Support Officer.
- If a subject's attendance unauthorised attendance falls below 80% you could be required to pay exam entries.
- If overall attendance falls below 90%, there is a greater chance of a student not meeting their target grades and as such continuation into Year 13 maybe jeopardised.
- Ensure leave of absence forms are completed and handed to the Pastoral and Academic Support Officer for any days
 out that are authorized.
