Transition Activities

Over the next few weeks, we have transition opportunities for all students to take part in albeit adapted to ensure all involved are safe. Keeping with the Public Health England (PHE) guidelines published on 15.6.21, we have planned our events to ensure:

- We limit visiting student mixing between bubbles (different schools)
- We limit the number of different visiting pupils at the same time
- We avoid compromising the existing social distancing arrangements within the class
- We consider the use of outside space as much as possible
- We encourage all participants to take an LFD test prior to any visit
- We ensure that the pupils involved understand the arrangements that are in place to reduce the risk of transmission of the virus

However, due to Bedford being a high-risk area for the Delta variant, our advice as a school on transition may change over the coming days following the Local Authority update this Friday. We will therefore confirm with you our plans for a transition/step-up day as soon as we are aware. We very much hope we have an opportunity to meet all students before September, but student and staff safety is obviously our number one priority.

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In spite of the ongoing COVID19 pandemic, we are dedicated to a smooth transition for your child and have arranged the following events:

- An opportunity for parents to meet the Principal, Head of Year and tutor virtually. We will provide a presentation and an opportunity to ask questions directly to the year team. The sessions are at the following times:

A link to the zoom meeting will be sent on Friday 25th June. The session will be recorded and shared at a later date for those unable to attend.

As students will not have had all the transition opportunities usually afforded to them, we plan to complete additional activities in September. Students will not attend their normal timetabled lessons straight away and, social distancing permitting, will be able to take part in ice-breaker challenges with their tutor group and house, meet their year team and take part in activities that will support them in finding their way around the academy. These activities have been informed through the concerns that were raised from the first steps forms the year 8s have completed and should allow us to mitigate these worries in the first few days in September. We want to take the opportunity to reassure you that your child's wellbeing and smooth transition is paramount in this process. In addition to the event outlined above, we also provide the following support:

- Our responses to the students' questions (via FAQs- attached)
- An opportunity for students to get to know their year team (via a fact sheet- attached)
- Finally, to find out a little bit more about our new students we have put this form together for them to complete if they wish to share something about themselves. An attachment is also included if they prefer to complete a hard copy "This is ME!"

Transport

If your child is eligible for home to school transport assistance, Central Bedfordshire Council will distribute the passes over the summer term. Central Bedfordshire Council and other Transport providers are following government guidance on how your child can get to and from their school.

With social distancing rules still in effect, pupils should, wherever possible, avoid public transport (including school transport) and either walk, cycle or travel in your car

If your child is eligible for home to school transport assistance School transport will still be provided, in the usual way, for pupils that cannot make their own way to school. Due to social distancing, this will operate with a reduced number of seats. As government guidance is updated, Central Bedfordshire will release information regarding the changes to social distance rules on transport.
